Great Eastern Hwy

Shoulder Widening Kellerberrin to Northam

Following Australia Day, Main Roads will start shoulder widening on the Great Eastern Highway from the Restdown Street intersection in Kellerberrin, through to Northam.

Once the shoulders have been widened between Kellerberrin to Northam, the road crew will work from Northam back to Kellerberrin. The works will take approximately 3 months.

Lane closures and speed restrictions will be in place from Thursday 4 February onwards.

A lead vehicle will take traffic through the roadworks. Traffic management will be in place during the working hours of 7am to 7pm.


TAMMIN LIBRARY NOW OFFERS BORROW BOX EBOOKS AND EAUDIOBOOKS.

Here are some fire safety tips

Switch off monitors and TVs before going to bed

Keep candles in a safe location

Clean up barbecue grease

Check your barbecue gas bottle expiry

Facing all cookware handles away from the edge of your counter



Keep tea towels away from your cooktop



Trim tree branches that could transfer fire into your home.



Ensure all leaves are cleaned out from your gutters



Clothes dryer safety, only put dryer on when you are at home



Make sure you change your smoke alarm batteries every 12 months



Do not leave charges on while not in use (most common cause of a fire)



January Works Report

The Shire of Tammin crew have started work in town on Shields Street and Booth Street. Shields Street is now sealed and new asphalt revetment will be installed along new kerbing on Booth Street in the coming weeks. This will create parking bays and traffic delineation between red and black asphalt.

The Information Bay is also undergoing some upgrades. Three new planter boxes have been installed. New footpaths and pram ramps will be installed on Shields Street, at the KEP Park and also at the info bay. Resurfacing of areas near the Lesser Hall and Tennis Court will also take place for safer access for pedestrian.

Roadworks on Bungulla North Rd on a section of 3km has been completed, with extra work coming in the next month. Works on Yorkrakine Rd near the Golf Club has also been completed as well as shoulder widening and seal on Tammin South Road on a section of approximately 3km. More work will be happening on Tammin South Rd on a 700m section.

New brick paving has been installed at the Lesser Hall and a new footpath from the public toilets to join with Shields St.

During the months of December and January, 2 Speed Display Signs were installed near the Oval on the Tammin Wyalkatchem Rd and McLaren St as a friendly reminder to all road users that the posted speed limit is 60km/h and 50km/h. The process was welcomed by the community and positive feedback made this exercise well worth it. The Shire of Tammin intend to acquire 2 Speed Display signs and installed them at strategic locations within town and on Great Eastern Hwy.

Main Roads has started work on a section of Great Eastern Hwy between Northam and Kellerberrin, They will be working on the road shoulders. Traffic control will be in place for some time.

Note that the dates below represent official term dates however many schools elect to start the students back on slightly different dates.

In Western Australia, school term lengths range between 9-11 weeks.

CALL 000 TO REPORT A FIRE!

Are you interested in the biosecurity of Western Australia's agricultural industries?

Western Australian producers and other stakeholders in the dairy, beef, grain/seed, hay, sheep and/or goat industries and respective supply chains are invited to apply for positions on Industry Funding Scheme Management Committees and/or the Industry Funding Scheme Review Panel.

Industry Funding Schemes enable agricultural industries to raise funds to address priority pests and diseases at a whole-of-industry level.

The schemes are industry-driven and overseen by a Management Committee made up of producers and others with appropriate industry knowledge and expertise.

The Review Panel reviews applications for payments made under the Industry Funding Scheme regulations, where the applicant is dissatisfied with the outcome of their application and requests a review.

The Minister for Agriculture and Food appoints members for a period of up to three years. The Department of Primary Industries and Regional Development provides support to the schemes, committees and panel.

During 2021, there will be vacancies on the following Management Committees:

Cattle Industry Funding Scheme (4 vacancies)

Grains, Seeds and Hay Industry Funding Scheme (4 vacancies)

Sheep and Goat Industry Funding Scheme (4 vacancies)

From 1 July 2021, there will be three vacancies on the Industry Funding Scheme Review Panel.

The Management Committees meet quarterly on dates agreed by members. The Review Panel convenes when a review of an application for payment, made under the Industry Funding Scheme regulations, is requested.

Members of the Management Committees and Review Panel are remunerated, including sitting fees and travel expenses.

More information, including the terms of reference and selection criteria, is available on the Department of Primary Industries and Regional Development website at agric.wa.gov.au. Search for 'Committee membership EOIs'.

The Western Australian Government is committed to ensuring diversity on Government boards and committees and, in particular, increasing the representation of women to 50 per cent.
