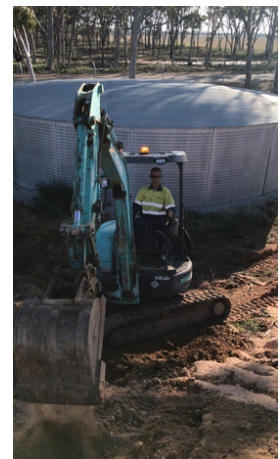
WORKS REPORT

The Works crew have been keeping warm and busy through the coldness that June brought. We have been taking advantage of the favourable conditions to complete some much needed maintenance grading, with both the Shire's grader and two contract graders working on our roads. Grading has recently been undertaken on Yorkrakine Road Rd, Nock Rd, Yorkrakine Rd, Cemetery Rd, McQueen Rd and Yorkrakine West Rd on the North side of Tammin. In the South Nelson Rd has been re-sheeted with the graders now working on Goldfields road before they will progress to Tammin South and Cubbine Road. With the Sprayer unit refurbishment completed last month, sealed roads have now begin to be treated. Shields St has also undergone a new drainage system installation as the old drainage pits were inadequate.

Residents in town may have also noticed the new 130m long footpath that was installed on Strang St. More footpaths will be installed along Ridley St, Shield St and Walston St in the coming months, which will provide safer walking routes.

The town dam received some attention last month also in the form of removing the old foot valve and replacing it with a new submersible pump. Testing will be in progress for the next few weeks of the new pump.



The oval has also continued to receive general maintenance, including mowing for the Hockey and football matches and training.

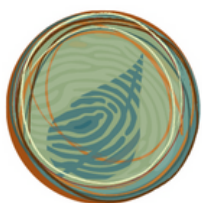

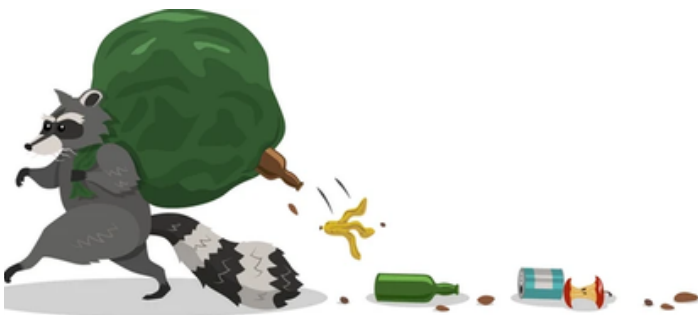
