Happy New Year! 2023 will see projects and capital works set out in the 22/23 Annual Budget progress, as well as many engaging annual and new community events come to fruition. The Shire continues to aim to deliver high quality services aligned with the visions and expectations of the community and we look forward to working with you in 2023!

We look forward to working alongside the community throughout the stages of development.

The Shire of Tammin has been affected by three separate bush fire incidents varying in severity in January 2023. This includes the Ralston Road fire, Bungulla North Road fire & Eleven Mile Road fire. Council and Staff would like to thank all who assisted, with a quick response from our local farmers, the Tammin Bush Fire Brigade, CESM Ben Davies, DFES and surrounding Brigades, the fires were contained and monitored.



The Ralston road fire saw Volunteers assisting from far and wide including 40 farm units, and 41 fire appliances coming from of Corrigin, the Shires Cunderdin, Kellerberrin, Goomalling, Merredin. Northam, Quairading, Tammin, Toodyay & York. Thank you to neighbouring Councils and contractors for their support with both labour and plant. The two DFES helicopters were quickly dispatched from Northam, giving much needed assistance dispersing over 9,000 litres of water.

Thank you to the Tammin Roadhouse for assisting with welfare for all incidents, supplying much needed water and food within a short time frame as well as the Rapid Relief team.

As always, emergencies highlight our strong community spirit, thank you everyone for your ongoing support and contribution to our district.

WORKS UPDATE

Items of Importance

The Tammin Southern Link Project is progressing smoothly with the base work well underway at the moment. The project is all going to plan with the new drainage already installed. All in all, the project should be in the final stages by the end of February.

The Shire's outside crew are looking forward to the arrival of the new grader this month as they will be able to put it to use with this years maintenance grading program.

The Donnan Park Pavilion has had an upgrade with the new public BBQ installed recently. It looks fantastic and we can't wait for the community to utilise the new space.

On the ground actions

January saw important on the ground actions including tree lopping under power lines to avoid contact or damage from falling tree branches or windy weather conditions. Due to the high voltage that flows through powerlines it is essential to keep an eye on your trees.

The outside crew have also been patching potholes on various roads as well as conducting footpath works along Walston Street. It is anticipated that the works will be completed in the following weeks, subject to weather conditions.

While working through the usual day to day duties, many of our outside staff members attended the recent Tammin bush fires. Thank you to our team for working with local emergency services to protect our community.
