CEO UPDATE

Community Grants

I am thrilled to announce the outcome of the Shire of Tammin's Community Grant round. After careful consideration, the Council has resolved to contribute to three projects that will greatly benefit our community.

- The Tammin Hockey Club will receive \$900 towards the purchase of a new line marking machine, which will benefit multiple sporting organisations as well as the Tammin Primary School.
- The Tammin Garden, Heritage, and Recycling Club will be granted \$1,000 for the second stage of their history board project at the Tammin Roadhouse.
- Lastly, the Tammin P&C will receive a contribution of \$2,100 towards the purchase of shade sails that they will install over play equipment at the Tammin Primary School.

We believe these initiatives will enhance our community's sports facilities, preserve our local history, and provide much-needed shade for our children while they are at school.

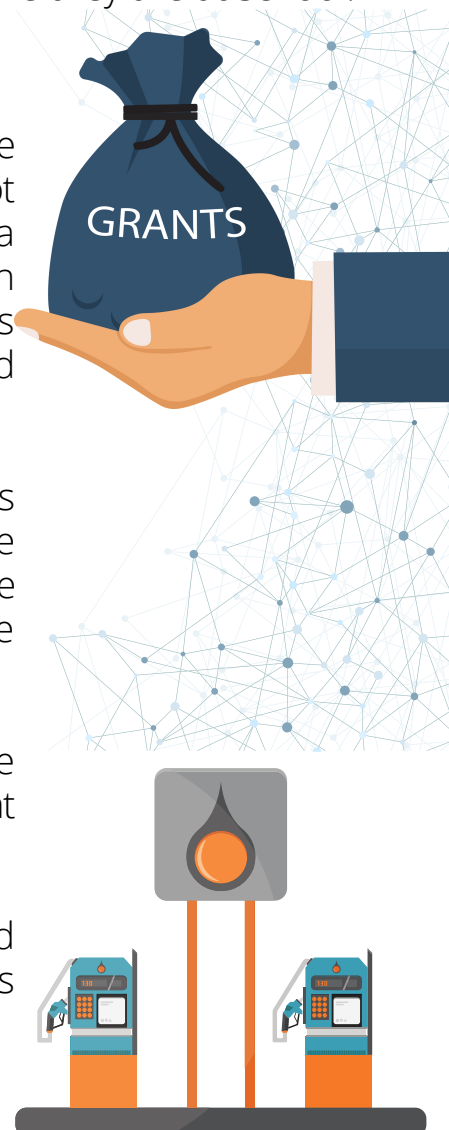
Unmanned Fuel DA Outcome

At the May Ordinary Council Meeting, Council considered the Development Application request for the Unmanned Fuel facility on Lot 251 Great Eastern Highway Tammin. It is significant to note that as a consequence of the applicant's discussions and negotiations with Main Roads WA following completion of public advertising, the proposal has now been amended to address various issues and concerns raised regarding traffic safety.

Amendments include the relocation of the proposed refuelling facilities with greater setbacks from the highway including the demolition of the existing buildings on the land, reconfiguration of and upgrades to the two existing crossovers to the Highway and prohibition of access to the facility by all east-bound vehicles along the Highway.

Based on these amendments the Council resolved to approve the Development Application with 16 conditions associated with that approval.

Home Changeroom Upgrades

The home changerooms at Donnan Park are getting a well deserved makeover ahead of the first Tammin home game in July.

Work has commenced on redoing all the plumbing and tiling to modernise and refresh the space. The Shire plans to update one area each year at the pavilion starting with the home change rooms.

Next on the agenda will be the ladies public toilets which are planned to be included in the 2023/2024 budget that is currently being drafted for Council considering in July.



Netball Court Repairs

Repairs to the Netball Courts has been undertaken to ensure the surface is ready to host the first Tammin home game in July. Unfortunately due to the large trees in the proximity of the Courts we have experienced some lifting of one of the slabs that caused issues with the playing surface. This has been rectified for the coming season however the issue is likely to continue in the medium term and Council will investigate some longer term options.

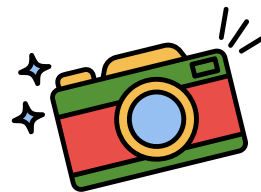
