State Government to give \$565,828

The Hon Brendon Grylls has announced, as part of the Royalties to Regions commitment, funding of \$400m over 4 years for the Country Local Government Fund from which the Shire of Tammin will be eligible for \$565,828 in 2008/09. The funds are restricted to asset renewal and asset creation. Further funding will be provided for the next 3 years.
