Bushfires / Wildfires

With the fire season once again here, it is timely to remind everyone of fire preparedness:

- Have you made the decision do I stay or do I leave?
- Have you got your fire kit organised protective or cotton clothing, boots, hat, water?
- Is your fire fighter operational?
- Are your firebreaks up to scratch?

Also, have you registered to receive harvest and vehicle movement ban information via SMS on your mobile telephone? Bans will still be broadcast over the UHF radio network and the dial up recorded message service (9487 6021) will be continued.

If you attend a fire, the following protocols need to be observed:

- Switch your UHF radio to Channel 5 (emergency channel).
- When you arrive, announce yourself and your equipment over Channel 5 and seek instruction / direction.
- If you are first at the fire, take charge until you can hand over to a more experienced fire fighter or a
 fire control officer of a FESA officer.
