Licensing Transactions

The Shire of Tammin wishes to advise that all licensing transactions are available every Monday - Friday 9am - 4pm.











KidSport enables kids aged 5-18 years to apply for financial assistance for club fees to participate in community sport and recreation, no matter their financial circumstances.

What is the Kidsport Program?

The Department of Sport and Recreation and the Shire of Tammin understand the important role clubs and sport play in creating a positive and active community and feel that all children should have the opportunity to be involved.

KidSport makes it possible for eligible children to join a not-for-profit sport or recreation club, by contributing up to \$200 towards club registration fees.

What is the eligibility criteria?

- Live within the Shire of Tammin
- Be aged 5 18 years
- Have a Health Care Card or Pensioner Concession Card or if in financial hardship be referred by a Kidsport Financial Assessor.

How do I apply?

- Check you meet the eligibility criteria.
- Ensure you have an electronic copy of your Health Care / Pensioner Concession Card (scanned or photographed copy is fine). The file is required to be uploaded onto the online form in any of the following formats .doc,.docx,.pdf,.png,.jpg,.jpeg (Max: 5 MB).
- Go to the Department of Sport and Recreation (DSR) website and click on the KidSport link on the right hand side.
- On the KidSport homepage, click on the 'Apply for KidSport Online' link, to open online form.
- Complete all the fields on the online form and upload a copy of your Health Care / Pensioner Concession Card.
- An automated email confirmation of your application will be sent through to the email address that you provided on the form. If you do not receive this email after a few hours, please contact the Shire.

The Shire of Tammin will now assess the application and you will be informed, via email, if it has been approved or rejected.

I don't have access to a computer to apply online?

Alternatively you can still complete a paper-based form and submit it to the Shire for processing.

Please contact the Shire Administration Office if you require more information or would like an application form.

Junk, Whitegoods and Metals

- √ Whitegoods (fridges, stoves, microwaves etc.)Doors must be removed from fridges and freezers
- √ Scrap metal
- ✓ General junk (furniture and other household items)
- √ Timber products (up to 1.5m long)
- ✓ Two trailer loads, '6' x 4' or 3m3 excess waste will not be removed

Green Waste

- ✓ 1.5m in length✓ 300mm in diameter
- √ Two trailer loads, 6' x 4' or 3m3 excess green waste will not be removed.

Free Men W vaccine for Wheatbelt teens

Wheatbelt teenagers aged 15 to 19 years are encouraged to get the free meningococcal ACWY vaccine to help protect them and others against this serious disease.

<u>Last month</u>, <u>Minister for Health Roger Cook announced the three-year state-wide vaccination program</u>, which targets teenagers who are most at risk of developing the disease.

Phase one starts in school term two in some secondary schools and all Aboriginal medical services for year 10, 11 and 12 students.

Phase two commences in school term three across WA for year 10, 11 and 12 students and university students at on-campus medical centres.

Phase three starts in school term four with GP surgery vaccination (subject to vaccine availability) for year 10, 11 and 12 students who missed their school vaccination in terms two or three, and teenagers aged 15 to 19 who are not at school or university.

People turning 20 before early October 2017 should contact local Population Health Unit before their birthday to ask how they can receive their free vaccine.

In 2018 and 2019, the program will target incoming year 10 students only.

WA Country Health Service Wheatbelt Public Health Physician Dr Naru Pal said meningococcal disease is an uncommon, life-threatening illness caused by a bacterial infection of the blood and/or the membranes that line the spinal cord and brain, and occasionally of other sites.

"The vaccine will help protect teenagers against meningococcal, and minimise the spread of the disease," Dr Pal said.
