In 1985, the United Nations designated 5 December each year as the International Volunteer Day, also known as Thank a Volunteer Day in WA. Each year, the Department of Communities provides funding to assist communities throughout Western Australia to hold an event or display on Thank a Volunteer Day / International Volunteer Day, 5 December.

Communities that receive a Thank a Volunteer Day Celebration Grant are required to hold their event or activity on Wednesday, 5 December 2018, as part of Western Australia's Thank a Volunteer Day and International Volunteer Day. If this date is not suitable for regional applicants, because of local area issues such as harvest time or bush fire season, communities may hold their celebration any time in the three months following 5 December 2018.




Tammin Tourist Sites

Why not take some time out to have a look at some of Tammin's historical sites?

Yorkrakine Rock is a granite rock formation located approximately 25km north of Tammin and 50km south east of Dowerin in the Eastern Wheatbelt region of Western Australia. It makes up part of the Yorkrakine Rock Nature Reserve and is located on the Tammin Wyalkatchem Road.

Hunts Well is a historical site located a few kilometres south of Tammin on Goldfields Road. It was once used as a watering point for prospectors and others enroute to the Goldfields. It is worth a visit to see this important part of the state's history.

Or if your not one for the outdoors come and enjoy our air conditioned library at the Tammin Shire Office, with a wide range of books to suit everyone's taste.

ESTABLISHMENT OF PLACES WHERE DOGS ARE PROHIBITED ABSOLUTELY AND PLACES WHICH ARE DOG EXERCISE AREAS UNDER \$31(3A) OF THE DOG ACT 1976

Places where dogs are prohibited absolutely


Dogs are prohibited absolutely from entering or being in any of the following places –

- (a) a public building, unless permitted by a sign;
- (b) a theatre or picture gardens;
- (c) all premises or vehicles classified as food premises or food vehicles under the *Health (Food Hygiene) Regulations 1993*;
- (d) a public swimming pool; and
- (e) the following reserves -
 - (i) Reserve 26973, Memorial Park and Kadjininy Kep Water Feature, Donnan Street, Tammin;
 - (ii) Reserve 6679, school site, Ridley Street, Tammin;
 - (iii) Reserve 10695, Cemetery, Great Eastern Highway, Tammin; and,
 - (iv) Reserve 16985, Cemetery, Yorkrakine Cemetery Road, Yorkrakine.

Places which are dog exercise areas

For the purposes of sections 31 and 32 of the Act, the following is a dog exercise area -

- (a) Lot 13, Station Road, Tammin, Recreation Reserve 8789;
- (b) Subclause (a) does not apply to -
 - (i) land which has been set apart as a children's playground;
 - (ii) an area being used for sporting or other activities, as permitted by the local government, during the times of such use; or
 - (iii) a car park.

While the Shire has done it best to ensure the town is ready for bush fire season we have unfortunately had to send infringements out to properties that are non compliant.

Property owners please clean up your yard to ensure the safety of others in the community.

This time of year grass and shrubs over 7.5cm is deemed hazardous due to the dryness of the vegetation and a risk of a fire starting.

The Shire will be taking action on the non compliant blocks, with all costs incurred to be levied against the properties rates.

A hot works ban is defined as a ban on the outdoor use of welding, grinding and abrasive tools on properties within the Shire.

Movement bans will be applied by the chief bush fire control officer when weather conditions indicate it necessary.

Bans will be advertised on the Shire of Tammin Website and Facebook. Text messages are also send via the Shire of Tammin sms service.



Works & Services - January 2019

After the Christmas / New Year break the Works and Services crew have been busy working on the RV Site located at Donnan Park, which is now operational but still has a few weeks before completion.

Road repairs have been carried out on the school bus route and surrounding roads. Goldfields Road is now re-open after damages through harvest and we thank locals for there patience. If there are any concerns to local roads please contact the Shire of Tammin, without your feed back we may not be aware.

We are aware of the concern in regards to the Corella shooting, please be advised the shooting will be ongoing at the Tammin oval. This is to scare the birds away. The Shire is trying to maintain damages cause by the Corella's, this is proving to be an uphill battle.

The bowling green, oval, street lights, roof on the Kep and the Christmas tree lights are just a few damages caused by the Corellas.

Upcoming work

The Shire will be clearing blocks in town that are non-compliant with Bush Fire Act 1954. This work will be ongoing though the month of February.

Termite spraying is currently taking place to all Shire owned buildings and trees within the Shire of Tammin.

Litter and Illegal Dumping

The Shire of Tammin encourages residents and visitors to help keep our natural environment clean and litter free.

Littering is an offence under the *Litter Act 1979* and the Shire Ranger will issue fines to offenders.

People illegally dumping waste in bushland areas or on road verges may receive a \$500 on the spot fine. Under the *Litter Act 1979* they could also face prosecution and incur a fine of up to \$5000.

Residents with any concerns or enquiries can contact Shire Administration Office on 9637 0300 during normal office hours.

Help us keep our town beautiful by:

- Depositing all litter in the bin
- Not depositing commercial or domestic waste in public litter bins
- Ensuring goods carried on trailers, utes and trucks are covered and properly secured
- Ensuring building site waste does not affect your neighbours
- Reporting abandoned vehicles
