Enrolling to vote

For the Local Government Election on 19 October 2019

My circumstances are:	Do I have to apply to be on the roll?
You live in the district (or ward) and are on the State electoral roll.	No need to apply.
You live in the district (or ward) and are not on the State electoral roll.	Yes—Get a form from any post office or the WA Electoral Commission and get the form back to them by 5:00pm on 30th August 2019.
You are not an Australian Citizen but were on the local government electoral roll in 1996 and have owned or occupied rateable property in the district since then.	Yes—See how to apply below.
Your property is rateable and is owned or occupied by more than two people or by a company.	Two people only who are not already on the local government roll for the district (or ward) must be selected by a majority of the owners or occupiers or the company. They must be on the State or Commonwealth roll to be eligible. If more than one property is involved the same two people must be nominated for all the properties.
You own property that is rateable in the district (or ward) and you are on the State or Commonwealth electoral roll but you live elsewhere.	Yes—See how to apply below.
You have a right of occupancy of property in the district (or ward) that is rateable and you are on the State or Commonwealth electoral roll but live elsewhere	If you have a right of continuous occupation under a lease, tenancy agreement or other legal instrument for at least the next three months following the date you apply you should make an application—See how to apply below.

How to apply

You can get an "Enrolment Eligibility Claim" form from any local government office. To be able to vote for this election your application must reach the person named below by 4:00pm on the 30th August 2019. Those nominated by a company must attach the letter of nomination to the form.





It is a great way to bring the kids together to really enjoy themselves without all the noise!


This event was supported by the Shire of Tammin and Lotterywest and was held in the Lesser Hall, we hope all kids enjoyed themselves.


Tammin History

The first European to settle in the area was John Packham in 1893. The railway to Southern Cross was constructed through the area in 1894-95, and Tammin was one of the original stations when the line opened in 1895. As the surrounding area developed for agriculture, there was sufficient demand for land in the area for the government to declare a townsite, and Tammin townsite was gazetted in 1899.

Tammin is an aboriginal name derived from the nearby Tammin Rock, a name first recorded by the explorer Charles Cooke Hunt in 1864. The rock possibly derives its name from the "Tammar", the Aboriginal name of the "Black Gloved Wallaby" which was once found in this area. Another source records it as possibly meaning "a grandmother or a grandfather".


The local Agricultural Hall was opened in 1911 by the Minister of Agriculture.

In 1932 the Wheat Pool of Western Australia announced that the town would have two grain elevators, each fitted with an engine, installed at the railway siding.






Tammin Airfields



Old Tammin Primary


Train Station




Harvesting at Wheeldon's farm

Works and Services Crew has been busy with road construction in the months of May and June.

The maintenance grading programme is commencing as we now have moisture in the ground.

New fencing has been installed around the basketball/netball court at the oval.
