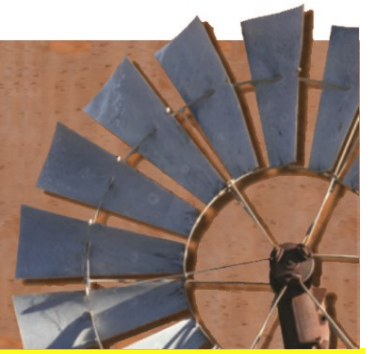

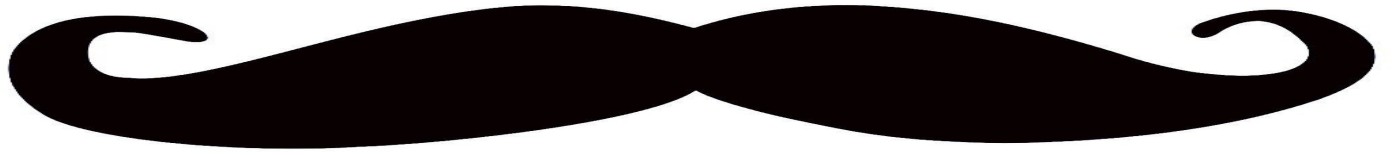

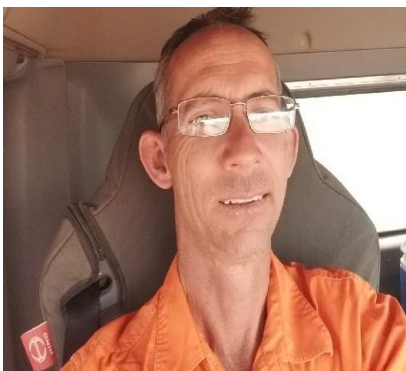

Nominations Requirements

Candidates are required to lodge with the Returning Officer:

- a completed nomination in the prescribed form, signed and witnessed. (This form is available from the Returning Officer, the Western Australian Electoral Commission or the Shire of Tammin;
- a single A4 page profile containing not more than 150 words of information about the candidate;
- a nomination deposit of \$80 (cash, bank cheque or postal order);
- a recent passport-sized photograph (optional);
- every candidate must complete the online candidate induction module available at www.dlgc.wa.gov.au

Where an agent lodges a nomination on a candidate's behalf, it must be in the prescribed form with a written authorisation signed by the candidate.

The documents may be hand delivered or posted to the Returning Officer and must be received by the close of nominations.



Works & Services - October 2019

Works and Services Crew have been busy with preparation work for the road program. Currently the crew is upgrading the drainage system on section of roads where new seal will be applied in January 2020. The Shire crew is cleaning and clearing the verges to facilitate the work progress in the coming months. The Shire contractor is working on widening the section of road on Tammin Wyalkatchem Rd and also a section of road on Tammin South Rd.

The new cricket pitch get its final preparation work by the club, which will settle it down to its final levels and the new grass will be mowed by the end of this month, ready for the start of the season coming.

Works and Services have welcomed in the crew two new staff members; this will enhance the working efficiency of the team. Our town maintenance crew is working diligently around all parks and gardens, keeping Tammin beautiful.

As you may have noticed, the corellas are making a comeback around town, the Works and Services crew will be using gas cannon as a scare tactic from time to time, mainly around the oval and also the CBH bins. This process will not harm the birds, it just create a loud bang to scare them off.

Works and services are still looking for some existing or potential gravel pits, around the month of January 2020, I will be in contact with land owner to identify and excavate some test pits in area where gravel could be sourced for the maintenance of the road network. This gravel would be used within a radius 10km of pit to improve conditions of existing unsealed roads.
