ARE YOUR FIRE BREAKS COMPLIANT?

PURSUANT TO THE POWER CONTAINED IN SECTION 33 OF THE BUSH FIRE ACT 1954, YOU ARE HEREBY REQUIRED ON OR BEFORE THE 1ST DAY OF NOVEMBER 2020 TO CONSTRUCT FIRE BREAKS TO YOUR PROPERTY.

ALL HAZARDOUS MATERIAL IS TO BE REMOVED FROM THE WHOLE OF THE LAND EXCEPT LIVING TREE, SHRUBS AND PLANTS. THE REMAINING VEGETATION IS TO BE MAINTAINED TO A HEIGHT OF NO GREATER THAN 7.5CM

September 2020 Works Report

The Shire of Tammin is working on shoulder maintenance of our sealed roads. We are currently working on the York Tammin Rd and then moving onto the Tammin Wyalkatchem Rd. Gardens and reserves within town are being kept well maintained. Thanks to David M. for the good work.

Unfortunately due to the low rainfall this year, our small dam is only at 30% capacity and the second dam is dry. We will try to save water as much as possible for the oval and keep it as green as possible.

Main Roads have done some repair works on Great Eastern Hwy; this work has made the road safer for all users. Some drainage work will take place in a couple weeks to improve the water drainage on the newly repaired sections.

A new section of footpath was added between the railway station and the Great Eastern Hwy, this will improve the access to the Southern side of town. Some signs and tactile pavers will be added in the next couple weeks. It was a little disappointing to see that whilst the concrete was drying, someone has taken the opportunity to write their names and doing damage to the freshly laid concrete. It may have been fun at the time for those in question but it certainly shows a lack of respect to the community who are contributing to the enhancement of Tammin.

Last month a traffic counter was installed in front of the pavilion and oval, this counter gives information on how many vehicles and the types of vehicles passing on the Tammin-Wyalkatchem Rd. The counter was installed in the 60km/h zone. The information given also relates to the speed of travelling vehicles. During a period of 30 days, we had 3,369 vehicles passing both directions. The concerning issue is that only 26.9% of the vehicle did travel at the posted speed limit or lower. 61.5% of the vehicles travelled at a speed between 60km/h and 90km/hr and 11.6% travelled at speeds between 90km/hr and 130km/hr. For those who have travelled at the correct speed limit, thank you. For the others, please think about your speed when passing the Donnan Park Recreation Centre.

On Wednesday 2nd September the Tammin and broader community were invited to come together for connection, a feed and solid yarning.



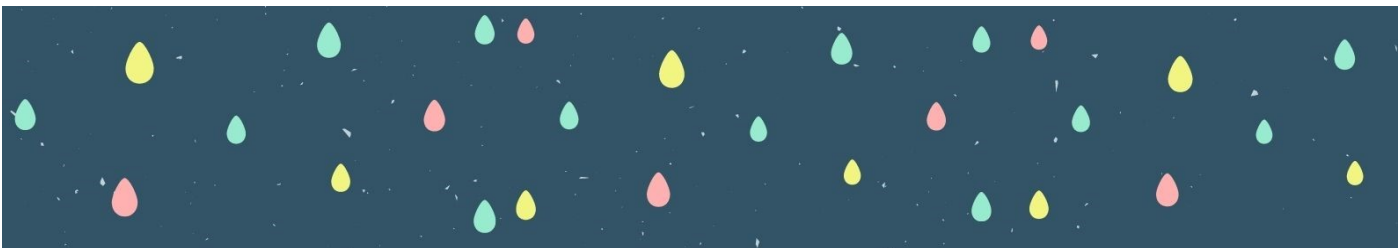
Everyone listened intently while Local Elder Marie Henry delivered Welcome to Country.

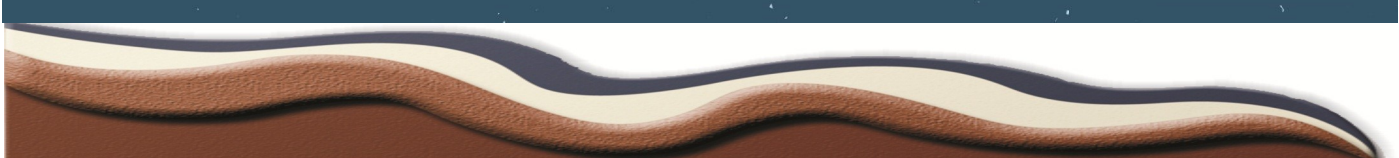
The Tammin Primary School students in attendance enjoyed activities, such as jewellery making with beads, woollen friendship bands and doll making from straw and wool.
