Are you a passionate person with great ideas for your community? If you are, you should stand for election and become a Shire of Tammin Councillor.

Nominations for Council are open for an 8 day period between 2nd September 2021 and 9th September 2021.

Nomination forms can be completed online, www.elections.wa.gov.au and click on the "Nominate as a local government candidate" section, alternatively paper copies are available at the Shire of Tammin Administration Office.

The Shire of Tammin Council will have 3 positions vacant as not all current sitting members are intending to re-nominate for council. These positions are required to be filled in order to have the required quorum of four members to operate. The failure to meet the quorum requirements will have adverse impacts on the future of the Shire.

Anyone intending to nominate for election must first complete a <u>free online induction</u> <u>course</u>, provided by the Department of Local Government, Sport and Cultural Industries (DLGSC).

LOCAL GOVERNMENT ORDINARY ELECTION CALL FOR NOMINATIONS Shire of Tammin

An Ordinary In-Person Election will be held on Saturday, 16 October 2021 in the Shire of Tammin to fill the following vacancies:

District 3 Councillors 4 year terms

Nominations Open on Thursday, 2 September 2021 **Nominations Close** at 4:00 PM Thursday, 9 September 2021 Nominations must be lodged with the Returning Officer:

- at any time during the above period by arrangement; or
- between 2:00pm and 4:00 PM Thursday, 9 September 2021 (close of nominations) at the Shire of Tammin, 1 Donnan Street, TAMMIN.

Nominations Requirements

Candidates are required to lodge with the Returning Officer:

- a completed nomination in the prescribed form, signed and witnessed. This form is available from the Returning Officer or the Western Australian Electoral Commission(<u>www.elections.wa.gov.au</u>);
- a single A4 page profile of not more than 800 characters (including spaces) containing information about the candidate;
- a nomination deposit of \$80 (cash, bank cheque or postal order);
- (optional) a recent passport-sized photograph of the candidate's head, or head and shoulders; and
- every candidate must have completed the online course titled Induction for prospective candidates, available at www.dlgsc.wa.gov.au, prior to nominating.

The Commission has developed an online system called Nomination Builder to assist candidates to complete their nomination form which includes the candidate profile. This is the preferred method of completing the nomination form and profile for elections conducted by the Commission. Candidates complete their nomination details and profile, print the completed form which has a reference number allocated and lodge it with the Returning Officer. The nomination builder can be accessed via www.elections.wa.gov.au.

Where an agent lodges a nomination on a candidate's behalf, it must be in the prescribed form with a written authorisation signed by the candidate.

The documents may be hand delivered or posted to the Returning Officer and must be received by the close of nominations.



Important information about your water supply



Low water pressure – Tammin town 8pm Wednesday 8 September – 8pm Thursday 9 September 2021

Water Corporation is upgrading a 1.4km length of the Goldfields Pipeline that supplies water to customers between Perth and Kalgoorlie. The section, located between Tammin and Kellerberrin, is aged and needs replacing to ensure reliability of water supply to nearby customers.

To allow connection of a new piece of pipe to replace the aged section, we will need to temporarily disconnect the town of Tammin from the Goldfields Pipeline. Tammin town properties will be supplied potable water via a portable tank, which will be at lower pressure, during this time, before we restore the main supply and reconnect the town.

When: 8pm Wednesday 8 September - 8pm Thursday 9 September 2021

During this time, toilets and other water using appliances may take longer to fill, or you may notice water from your taps being of lower pressure than usual.

Water Corporation appreciates this essential work will cause some inconvenience to some customers in Tammin and we thank you in advance for your cooperation.

Discoloured Water

This work may result in the water having a discoloured appearance. If this occurs, the water is still safe to drink however:

- Run the outside garden tap at the front of your property for a few minutes, until the water clears.
- Repeat the step above for an outside tap at rear of your property.
- Call us on 13 13 75 if the water does not clear.
- Do not use washing machines, dishwashers or other water-using appliances until the water is clear.

Special Circumstances

Contact our 24 Hour Faults, Emergencies and Security Line on 13 13 75 if you:

- ·have special circumstances we need to be aware of before this essential work starts
- ·are experiencing issues with your water supply service.

If your property is tenanted, please pass this notification on to the occupier.

CALL 000 TO REPORT A FIRE!

BUSHFIRES ACT

FUEL REDUCTION AND FIRE-BREAK REQUIREMENTS

Pursuant to the powers contained in Section 33 of the Bush Fires Act 1954, you are hereby

required on or before the 1st day of November 2021 to construct fire breaks and/or clear your property of flammable material in accordance with the following, and thereafter to maintain fire breaks up to and including the 1st day of April 2022.

Townsite:

Land Area less than 2048m2

All hazardous material is to be removed from the whole of the land except living trees, shrubs and plants. The remaining vegetation is to be maintained to a height of no greater than 7.5cm.

Townsite:

Land Area greater than 2048m2

All land over 2048m² is to comply with the requirements of rural land

This is to be maintained for the duration of the restricted and prohibited burning periods.

Tammin Rural Land

All land is required to have a bare mineral earth fire break not less than 3 meters in width immediately inside all external boundaries of said land.

All land surrounding erected buildings is required to be cleared of all flammable material by way of burning, slashing or mowing, and maintained to a height not greater than 75mm.
