CEO UPDATE

2022/23 SHIRE OF TAMMIN BUDGET:

At the July Ordinary Meeting of Council the 22/23 Budget was adopted by Council. Some of the exciting projects and programs included in this year's budget are:

- New Golf Club Building
- Completion of the Southern Link Project
- Installation of a floodway on Cubbine Rd and Yorkrakine Rd
- Gravel resheeting on sections of Turon Rd & Youering Rd
- New footpaths on Walston, Ridley and Shields Street
- Upgrade to tourism information infrastructure
- Upgrades at the Pavilion including re-tiling in the home changerooms, improved disability access ramps, trophy cabinets and a new outdoor BBQ.
- Upgrades at the Administration Building including a new carpark area at the front to improve access for seniors and solar panels to the building.
- Replacement grader and roller.

SCHOOL HOLIDAY ACTIVITY :

During the July School Holidays we had a fantastic turnout of 19 local children working together to create an entry into WALGA's showcase in pixels competition. The kids reflected on what it is they enjoy about living in Tammin and channeled that into their collective artwork. It was a fantastic activity that had on display the immense pride that the kids have for their little town. We can't wait for their masterpiece to be display on the big screen at Yagan Square in the middle of Perth in September/October.



INTERSECTION CLEARING - SCHOOL BUS ROUTE:

The Shire has recently undertaken some clearing works at the intersection of Ralston Rd & Gardener Reserve Rd; an intersection which is part of a School Bus route. This clearing was necessary to improve road safety by ensuring adequate line of sight was available to vehicles when turning onto Ralston Rd. A clearing permit was required to undertake the works; a process that took the Shire 14 months to obtain. We appreciate everybody's patience while we obtained the required permit to ensure these critical works could be undertaken. I would like to thank Fabian for his hard work in applying for and advocating for the clearing permit approval.

WORKS REPORT

The past month, has seen maintenance grading occur on many roads within the Shire boundaries. With the help of some local contractors, our crew have been able to focus maintenance repairs on unsealed roads at various locations. The works crew have also re-sheeted the first 2km of Nelson Rd and have achieved a great result .

Clearing of the intersection of Ralston Rd and Gardener Reserve Rd has been undertaken to open the line of sight for vehicles entering the intersection. This creates a safer environment for all road users. Sealed roads as well as the town site, have undergone weed treatment to ensure maintenance remains up to date.

Donnan Park oval and the pavilion have received some upgrades during July. New windows at the pavilion were installed to increase viewing options for spectators. New translucent sheeting has also been installed above the BBQ area that allows the sun to shine through, creating a much brighter and lighter area, especially on these darker winter days. Oval maintenance and mowing have continued throughout the previous month for hockey games.

In order to update our ageing fleet of works vehicles, Council have approved the purchase of a new grader and roller. We will be excited to share photos of these new investments as soon as they arrive.

BALLARDONG ABORIGINAL PLANISPHERE LAUNCH



The community was treated to a very special night at the Yorkrakine Hall for the launch of the Ballardong Aboriginal Planisphere.

The night commenced with a Welcome to Country by Local Elder Marion Kickett, followed by some traditional dancing around the campfire with the Ballardong Boys, treating us to their first performance as a group.

A stunning artwork created by Catrina from Ballardong Dreams was unveiled. The artwork was created in conjunction with the students at the Tammin and Wyalkatchem schools and features the Nyingarn (Echidna) which is the Aboriginal constellation this project was focusing on.

This artwork is beautifully presented on the planisphere that highlights when the Nyingarn can be seen in the sky throughout the year.

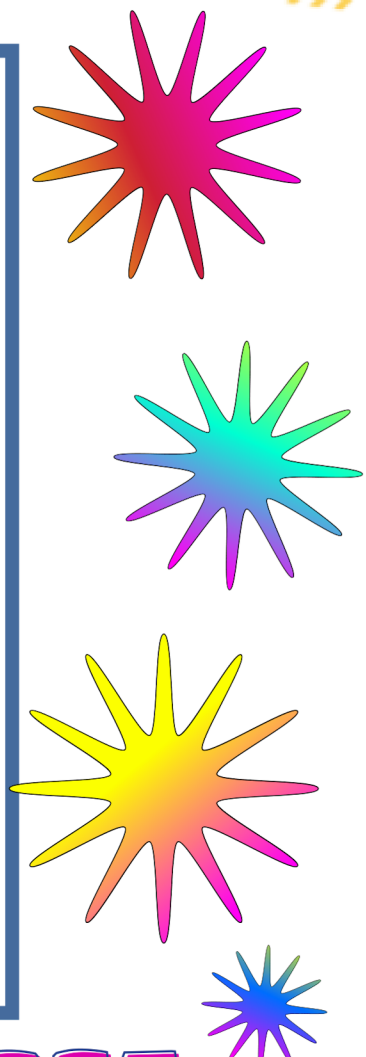
