Amalgamations Debate



The Minister for Local Government and Regional Development has given local governments until the 31 August 2009 to advise him of their amalgamation intentions – with the statement *If you don't want to do it, I'll do it.* Whilst the Premier has since ruled out forced amalgamations, he has urged all local governments to voluntarily consider the process. The Nationals, Labor Party and 2 Independents have also given the advice they will not support forced amalgamations.

On 14 July the Minister visited Tammin to meet with the Great Eastern Country Zone in Tammin in the morning followed by a public meeting in Kellerberrin in the afternoon. Council has also held a workshop on 6 July with support from the WA Local Government Association to develop it's preferred position. Several Councillors also attended a workshop on 17 July provided by the Department of Local Government and Regional Development in Quairading. Mr Tony Cooke has been appointed to assist Council in developing it's final position submission due 31 August. Prior to then, a public meeting will be convened.

Community Sporting and Recreation Facilities Fund

Applications from not-for-profit sport, recreation or community groups and local government authorities seeking capital works grants to develop sport and recreation facilities are now open for the 2010/11 funding round of the Community Sporting and Recreation Facilities Fund (CSRFF). These grants are made available by the Western Australian Government.

Key changes have been made to CSRFF for the 2010/11 round. These include:

- an increase of the available funds from \$9 million per year to \$20 million per year
- introduction of a development bonus, allowing up to 50% funding of the total project cost for projects that meet certain criteria (previously one third)
- introduction of two small grant rounds per year, for grants with a project cost of under \$150,000, allowing quicker release of funds
- quarantining of a portion of the available funds for sustainability initiatives and non-metropolitan pool upgrades

Applicants must discuss their application with the Department of Sport and Recreation (DSR). Guidelines on eligibility and application forms are available from DSR offices.

The Jungle Book – A Musical Tale
